#### PEER LEADER ACTIVITIES

### PEER LEADER SURVEY RESULTS

**100%** reported an increase in:

- Knowledge around vaping, cannabis, alcohol, tobacco policies, and their impact on youth and vulnerable communities
- Confidence around public speaking, educating their peers, using data to create projects, and strengthening their community
- Skills in research and presentations
